
Pembroke Celebrates the Thoreau Bicentennial

April 18th - May 19th

The Pembroke Reads 2017 community-wide read will be part of the larger Thoreau Bicentennial Statewide Read, a yearlong event honoring the 200th birthday of Henry David Thoreau this July 12th. Join readers around the state in celebrating the many works and achievements of this famous local writer, philosopher, and naturalist.

The Pembroke Read will be *Cape Cod*, a collection of short stories focusing on several of Thoreau's trips to the area. Pick up a copy at the library, then join us at one of our many fun Cape Cod and Thoreau-themed events for all ages in April and May.

The Statewide Read is sponsored by the Walden Woods Project, University of Massachusetts Lowell Honors College, Massachusetts Center for the Book, Freedom's Way National Heritage Center, and the National Park Service.

This month our cheery Reference Librarian Stephanie shares a sampling of her favorite titles, series, and authors, each of which explores the lives of women in a different historical period. Try one or all!

Susan Fletcher's *Corrag* (or, *The Highland Witch*) relates the saga of its eponymous heroine, a young healer accused of witchcraft during the time of Scotland's Glencoe massacre. The descriptions of the Scottish Highlands in the late 17th century are beautifully crafted, and the moving story of this strong and brave young woman is lyrically told.

The *Maisie Dobbs* series by Jacqueline Winspear features another strong heroine, a former battlefield nurse turned psychologist and investigator in post-WWI England. These tales are of the cozy mystery genre. Each of the twelve books presents a different case while advancing the ongoing story of Maisie's past and personal life. Some of the more popular titles in the series are *Pardonable Lies* and *An Incomplete Revenge*. Stephanie recommends the audio versions, read by Orlagh Cassidy.

Elizabeth Gaskell was a British author known for her exploration of social mores and burgeoning industrialism in Victorian England. Her books *North and South* (which centers on the conflict between factory workers and masters) and *Cranford* (satirical sketches of life in a country village) have been made into popular BBC miniseries. Stephanie's favorite of Ms. Gaskell's novels is *Wives and Daughters*, her last and most extensive work which was nearly complete at the time of her passing.

Library Trustees Changes

Sincere thanks to Elaine Spalding, retired Trustee

After almost 21 years of service to the library and town, Elaine Spalding stepped down as Library Trustee in December 2016. Elaine first volunteered for many years at the library, then became an elected Trustee in 1995. She also served on the committee that designed the beautiful library building from 1996 to 1998. During her time as Trustee, Elaine further supported the library by attending events, donating books to the Children's collection, and donating Swedish-themed items for the Friends of the Pembroke Library auctions. Her advice, dedication, and good humor always kept Trustees' meetings productive and fun. She was Board Secretary for most of her tenure, a job at which she excelled and in which she took great pride. Elaine says she has always loved serving the library and will continue to visit often as a patron.

Carol Watches, longtime member and past President of the Friends of the Pembroke Library, applied and was appointed to serve in the seat vacated by Ms. Spalding. The Trustees are happy to work with her and she has "pulled papers" to run on the town ballot for the completion of the term.

Saturday, March 4th at 2:00 p.m.



The Friends purchase yearly museum/cultural passes to the following venues: Boston Children's Museum, Franklin Park Zoo, Heritage Museum and Gardens, Institute of Contemporary Art Boston, Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, Massachusetts Parks Pass, Museum of Fine Arts, Museum of Science, New England Aquarium, Plimoth Plantation, Roger Williams Park Zoo, South Shore Natural Science Center, and Stone Zoo.

The yearly passes are mainly funded by the Friends and a grant from the Cultural Council. Each year we provide approximately \$3,500 in funding towards the purchase of the passes. The discounted museum passes are available to a wide variety of area museums and parks and are used by many.
