## **Hotspots Available to Check Out!**

We are excited to announce that starting this month we will have two T-Mobile hotspots available to take home! The devices can be checked out for a 7-day period by any patron age 18 and over who lives in Pembroke, and they can be reserved on our website through the TixKeeper system (the same way you would reserve a museum pass). They cannot be renewed.

The hotspots allow access to high-speed wireless Internet anywhere that receives a T-Mobile signal. Up to 10 devices can connect at a time with unlimited data to provide a perfect solution for patrons with no Internet access at home, who are going on vacation, or who need to do work on the go.

## Staff Picks

Wondering what the staff here at the library is reading?
These are some of our favorites!

We at the Pembroke Public Library are a literate bunch, but reading is not our sole pastime! For this season's staff picks, we have chosen to offer suggestions from another popular form of entertainment: film. The library owns an extensive collection of movies in both DVD and VHS formats, and many more are available through interlibrary loan. Many of these are yearly traditions that will serve to augment the holiday spirit.

A surprising runaway favorite is *Love Actually*, a lovable mélange of interwoven stories with an all-star cast led by Hugh Grant, Colin Firth, and Emma Thompson. For a heartwarming romantic comedy, try *Brid get Jones' Diary*, in which a luckless, lovable Renée Zellweger makes a New Year's resolution which changes her life.

Many of the "modern classics" are

silly, feel-good movies which will unite the whole family in bouts of laughter. For example, Will Ferrell charms many of us in Elf, a hilarious portrayal of one of Santa's naïve crew as he is introduced to New York City. Also in this category is *Scrooged*, an updated version of A Christmas Carol starring Bill Murray, and Deck the Halls, wherein the competition between neighbors Matthew Broderick and Danny DeVito results in escalating comic mishaps. Chevy Chase reprises his role as Clark Griswald in National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation, a hilarious guilty pleasure. The Santa Clause is one of Tim Allen's more memorable roles as an unwitting successor to the suit. And who can resist the clever and tenacious eight-year old who is accidentally left behind by his family at Christmas and valiantly protects their home? Home Alone, released in 1990, is another new holiday classic.

Animated seasonal favorites abound. Topping our list are *Santa Clause is Coming to Town, Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer, How the Grinch Stole Christmas, Mickey's Christmas Carol,* and *The Year Without a Santa Claus.* A more recent animated holiday choice for ages

7 and up is *Rise of the Guardians*, a funny, imaginative fantasy starring Hugh Jackman as the Easter Bunny and Alec Baldwin as Santa Claus. A less well-known classic begins with a Hanukkah celebration; *An American Tail* follows a young mouse as he emigrates from Russia to America.

Of course, the tried-and-true classics are comforting traditions for many of the staff here at the PPL. Holiday Inn and White Christmas are annual holiday treats showcasing the song and dance talents of Bing Crosby, perfect for viewing during present-wrapping or tree-trimming. Christmas in Connecticut is an old-fashioned delight starring Barbara Stanwyck as a nontraditional career woman. In the 1994 remake of Miracle on 34th Street, Elizabeth Perkins and Dylan McDermott come to believe in the magic of Christmas. Jimmy Stewart's It's a Wonderful Life is another heartwarming and inspiring depiction of the Christmas spirit in action.

For an escape, a laugh, or an uplifting couple of hours' respite from the hectic holiday season, try one or more of these annual favorites!
